Born in New Jersey, her career began through music therapy after a horrific car accident that left her with head and spinal injuries. She spends most of her time travelling.

How would you describe your style? Whoo-hoo chichi! I'm passionate about my eco jewellery made by friends in Brazil and other sentimental items that I mix with beautifully designed pieces. It's very personal. The "whoo-hoo" is a bit nuts, the "chichi" more chic.

I have photosensitive eyes and wear vintage or styles by Orgreen, made from titanium, which are incredibly light and comfortable. Orgreen are the best for performers as heavy glasses can alter the tone of your voice.


